10:55am	RFP\Fiscal Update	Sean Waldron	Melissa shared the email from Ryan Hoseid that was received last night. There will be an internal system to support the boards. Current contract holders have until June 30th to either keep the current contract or move to the new system. Ross Edmunds, Ryan Hoseid and Sean Waldron will be in attendance at the Behavioral Health Board Leadership call tomorrow. Sean shared that after the Request for Proposal (RFP) development began, there were more Boards that were leaving the current fiscal partnership. The Department wanted to have a more sustainable system for the Boards which is how this solution came about. Specific questions can be posed at tomorrow's meeting because leadership will be present that could answer detailed questions better. Melissa asked if others had questions to ask, and if Sean is not able to answer those questions we will pose those at tomorrow's meeting. Chuck Christiansen asked if there needs to be legislation changed. Sean believes the Behavioral Health Authority can make these changes. The crisis response will happen Monday – Friday from 8 – 5 and will expand as the system is developed. Calls will still go through 988 and if there is a need to have a response the police will be dispatched. Joy asked what will happen with the PET team.
