- There was a question about if someone with a felony would be able to become a recovery coach or peer support. – IDAPA rules state who can and cannot be a peer support or recovery coach.
- There is a question about passing the background check required. – A person must have started the background process or completed the background process to attend the training.

What a client can expect:  The client information is reviewed by the team lead.  The client comes in for an assessment and an eligibility screening is done by Magellan.  A treatment plan is then worked on.  Staff who are part of the work:  There is a medical team that assists the clients with their medications.  There are two peer support specialists on the team.  Two counselors are also a part of the team.  They can have individual counseling either in the office or in the client's location.  They do med-checks.  This is a volunteer program.  They meet with clients in the jail as well.
