Please attend these meetings if possible. This will be a bit of a learning experience. They will most likely want to review the information before making their decision. The Washington County Courthouse meeting date is June 2 <sup>nd</sup> at 9:30 AM.

			The Payette County Courthouse is June 9 <sup>th</sup> at 10:30 AM.  Scholarship applications were sent out and will be reviewed during the Subcommittee meeting today. A Body and Mind will review the applications that the Subcommittee sends onto them. There were 22 applications received. It is important to have Adams County involved. Joy will follow up with Adams County soon.  Joy and Marc have talked to several successful recovery centers. Sustainability is important to the county and looking at successful recovery centers will help. They use grants and private funding in addition to fund raising. The communities understand the value which helps tremendously. The Fletcher Group is assisting with some technical aspects.

11:15am	Bylaw update	Melissa Mezo, Chair	Melissa shared the Bylaws. She wondered if there was a way to change the requirement of having a county commissioner as part of the Executive Committee.  It was mentioned that this is an expectation but maybe it could be a different role.

Section three mentions who the Executive Committee membership is. It would be good if we could reword that.

Joy mentioned that might be a requirement to start up.

Chuck Christiansen mentioned that it was set up with the original language of the code. He believes that if you have two of the three entities mentioned you are meeting the letter of the law even without the presence of a county commissioner. The language of the law hasn't changed since 2014.

Melissa mentioned that if there is a tie, the tie goes to the Yays and not the Nays.

There was a question regarding who will always be doing the secretarial duties now that DHW is overseeing the operational portion of the Board. Sean shared that in the foreseeable future DHW will be the operating partner.

Melissa believes the language is sufficient for the operational partner.

11:45am	Community Updates	All	Jared shared that there is a new safe and sober that is opening in Pocatello.
			Vito Kelso shared that there is a Crisis Intervention Team Collaborative will be having a 40-hour academy coming from August 4 – 8. There is a resource fair on August 6 <sup>th</sup> from 3 to 5 at the Nampa Police Dept. The law enforcement officers will be learning de-escalation tactics and how to deal with or work with someone who is in a mental health crisis. 			Marc shared that the Dept. of Corrections is working on meeting the community's needs. Probation officers are visiting the Southwest District Health office today to get a tour and see what they do. They are then going to tour the Western Idaho Community Crisis Center. We are trying to get a handout card created to give out when they do home visits.
			Intermountain Hospital has openings for adolescents aged 12 to 17. They also have day treatment (outpatient). There is also an evening availability. You don't need to be inpatient to attend the outpatient programs. Just call the main number and set up a time to come in for an assessment and get into services, usually the same day or next day.

Marti Hooper shared that there is an arcade night in which 100 people will be paid for to go. They just need to call and sign up. There is a bar-b-que in the park coming up. There are events planned every month until the recovery in the park and it's all free. If you can support the Breeze laundry, they have offered to assist us in providing laundry services for the homeless and will match dollar for dollar up to \$8,000. They have a debit card that is only usable in their washers which helps us to be able to fund this. We are starting free parenting classes as well.

Amber is now working with an ACT Team. Anyone in the community who is coming in and out of the hospitals or out of the jails the ACT can help bridge that gap between leaving the facilities and going back into the community.

Cottonwood Creek has openings for adolescents and adults in our inpatient as well as outpatient services. They are open 24/7 to take walk-ins for crisis services. There is a PHP program for adults only. There is also a program for adolescents and adult with plenty of openings. There is also an after school and evening program for those who have commitments during the day. These programs are for mental health services primarily.

Mary Wright shared that there is a training tomorrow on trauma informed care.

John Hall mentioned that there is room for some recovery coach training events. There are some scholarships through the board.

Lina Smith shared that there is a golf event coming up on June  $26^{th}$  from 1-4. There is free food (donations welcome). The flyer will be sent out.

			Kristen Heller mentioned that they are now offering Sublocade injections for MOUD patients at Terry Reilly.
