10:30am	Special Executive Committee and Executive Committee Update (last two meetings)	Joy Husmann, Vice-Chair	<p><i>There was discussion on the funding of the Three Rivers Community Center. This funding was not approved due to the nature of the type of request without the actual formation of a Board to support the work.</i></p> <p><i>Three positions for the R3BHB board were voted on. We are waiting for an appointment of the DHW representative.</i></p>
10:45am	Three Rivers Recovery Community Center update	Joy Husmann, Vice-Chair	<p><i>Sean Waldron discussed the funding decision for the Three Rivers Recovery Community Center. The Dept. cannot lease the space because of the liability.</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Investment from the community and who is willing to step up and assist. DHW cannot be the sole source.</i> • <i>Who is the person who is leading this?</i> • <i>What other money is being used to support this? Are there other financial backers?</i> <p><i>Joy shared that they could not find someone who could pay for the rent for the building.</i></p> <p><i>Sean shared that it might be possible for DHW to support the cost if the board was more established.</i></p> <p><i>Joy shared that the TRCC Board needs to get this moving.</i></p>
11:00am	Children's Mental Health/Provider Sub-Committee Update	Joy Husmann, Vice-Chair	<p><i>The Children's Mental Health/Provider Sub Committee will not meet this month.</i></p> <p><i>There could be some discussion on SB 1314 at this point.</i></p> <p><i>Senator Blaylock sponsored this bill that would remove the BHB's from DHW oversight.</i></p>

			<p><i>Sean Waldron shared that this just recently came to our attention at DHW. The DHW Chief of Staff is working on a public information memo that can be shared regarding this legislation. There is a provision that if it is signed by both House and Senate, it would dissolve the relationship with the boards immediately. This would also dissolve the oversight of the Behavioral Health Boards by the Behavioral Health Planning Council.</i></p> <p><i>The intent language implies that there is a duplication of work that they would like to eliminate. It also removes the Health and Welfare Board as well as the Regional Directors.</i></p> <p><i>Joy encouraged everyone to continue to volunteer for all the activities the Board supports.</i></p>
