The grant application was changed to fit in with the mission statement and governors report goals. Jennette will provide some criteria information. Rick – They will need to downsize the number of requests since they had 300k in requests and have about 100k to hand out. Rick is the children’s mental health committee chair and will be looking to have a meeting with all the subcommittee chairs to discuss options. The district health board holds funding not spent and has funding available to use a grant.

Region 6: Shantal Laulu- Children MH wellness wiggle, amazing turnout. Over 400 people. Fun run, kite flying, handstand contest. Judge Murray was honored. Judge Murray retired, and a new Judge Call will be taking over the position. MAC came to present at the board two weeks ago had 80 people for training regarding stress management and crisis calling. Prioritizing people on the list for mental health services. In the beginning of May had two police officers who were shot, they were prioritized for mental health. Continuing to review grant request. Still looking for a commissioner, and their current commissioner lost in the primary election and will need to find a new commissioner. Trying to increase representation outside of Bannock County. The Recovery Center in Bannock had their yearly breakfast, and it went well.
