The purpose of the Partnerships for Success (PFS) grant is to prevent underage drinking, and marijuana and methamphetamine use among youth.

#### Partnerships for Success program updates:

From mid-November through December, the PFS coordinator worked with partners to finalize multiple agreements. Agreements finalized include a subgrant with Western Central Mountains Youth Advocacy Coalition (YAC) to support the implementation of Planet Youth in New Meadows, an extended contract with Performance Digital Media for a parenting awareness campaign, and a subgrant with New Plymouth School District to support a speaker/workshop for students. We are in the final step of a finalizing a contract with Idaho Drug Free Youth (IDFY) to provide i2i Workshop and Policy Programs and Chapter establishment assistance to schools and have started sharing the opportunity for schools to apply for the programs.

The coordinator has been working on updating the action plan, discussing potential partnership opportunities with new partners, and amending the subgrant solicitation to reflect an organization-based funding award cap (\$10,000). Funding caps were previously based on activity. The updated subgrant solicitation has been finalized and is being sent to partners and updated on our website.

The purpose of the Partnerships for Success (PFS) grant is to prevent underage drinking, and marijuana and methamphetamine use among youth.

### Partnerships for Success program updates:

Over the past month, the PFS coordinator has worked with new partners to explore opportunities for projects. Partnerships currently being explored include the creation of a series of youth substance use trends and prevention tools by an SRO, community presentations focused on providing parents education on preventing youth substance use and risky behaviors, and supporting the implementation of the Trauma Informed Response Program (TIP) in Region 3. The coordinator is working with partners to create agreements with these partners.

In December and early January, the PFS coordinator also completed grant reporting for Q2 (October 1 – December 31), finalized new images for the parent awareness campaign, and conducted outreach to school nurses for the "How to talk to adolescents about substance use" SBIRT training. Two new SBIRT trainings were scheduled. The IDFY school partnership application deadline was extended to February 10<sup>th</sup>. We've received applications from 4 groups, and IDFY is working with these groups to schedule workshops and staff trainings.
