I am interested in serving on the Region 3 Behavioral Health Board because I think I would bring unique experience and education to the Board. I am deeply committed to the betterment of behavioral health services in our state. As a Certified Recovery Coach and a Certified Peer Support Specialist, I work with a broad spectrum of at-risk youth and adults.

I am an upbeat, strengths-based-centered person who believes recovery is possible! I currently work as a Certified Peer Support Specialist for Idaho Job Corps in Nampa, ensuring a safe and supportive environment. I serve as a positive role model to students and peer staff members, while facilitating and ensuring the social, academic, and personal adjustment of students in a group-living environment.

Before becoming a Certified Peer Support Specialist at Idaho Job Corps, I worked part-time as a Peer Support Specialist at State Hospital West and part-time for Trivium Life Services as a Certified Recovery Coach. At State Hospital West, I worked with clients who live with persistent mental illness. I routinely instructed clients in problem-solving, daily living, self-management, and connecting with community

support. I monitored client goals, achievements, and agreements; and I maintained client progress notes. I also participated in regular, interdisciplinary team meetings and guided clients in completing necessary documents to implement social services. I also explained applicable laws, policies, and procedures to clients. Additionally, I collected required client data, and I provided information and/or arranged for support services such as medical care, legal assistance, housing, employment, and other private and public community resources.

While at Trivium Life Services, I was assigned by Trivium to a grant project in the ER at St. Alphonsus Regional Medical Center, where I provided recovery coaching, education, support, and mentoring for individuals who were in the midst of a drug overdose. Previous to this grant, I was assigned by Trivium Life Services to St. Vincent de Paul, where I worked with men and women who were being released from incarceration from Idaho Department of Correction (IDOC). I have spent the past several years working with clients who have dual diagnoses of substance use disorder and persistent mental illness.

I feel my strengths, perspectives, and experiences would make me a strong asset to the Region 3 Behavioral Health Board.

I was recently appointed to serve on the Safe Teen Assessment Center (STAC) Advisory Committee, which was established through Southwest District Health. Southwest District Health is the backbone entity for the Safe Teen Assessment Center (STAC) program. The goal of the STAC program is to prevent youths' entrance into the juvenile justice and child welfare systems by providing connection to community-based resources and services. The SWDH STAC program provides community-based options for screening, assessment, resource connectivity, and short-term case management services for juveniles and their families.

988 has increased traffic to our existing services, behavioral health and healthcare. We have seen an expansion of behavioral health services with telehealth and more people entering into private practice. There were 20 individuals trained for CIT in Fruitland. We have seen an increase in the opportunities to become trained in peer/recovery support services. The Board is a conduit of information and resources to share within the 6 counties that we serve. Due to the diversity of the stakeholders in our community and on this board it allows for problem solving with any issues that arise. The Gem County Recovery Center has been able to expand services in Gem County due to the efforts to increase awareness and collaboration from the Board.

The BHB partnered with the PFS coordinator to distribute funding announcements offered through the PFS grant. Announcements included opportunities for organizations to receive trainings (Youth Mental Health First Aid, SBIRT trainings, and the Community Resiliency Model Training), as well as for funding to support community-led substance use prevention projects including the implementation of evidence-based programs (3rd Millennium Prevention & Intervention program, Botvin Lifeskills programs, and the Positive Action program), and environmental projects (lighting installation, increased signage, etc.). The R3BHB also supported the PFS coordinator in sharing information about available resources including prescription drug disposal and safe storage materials, and educational information and brochures. The men's shelter, the Lighthouse closed which is a devastation to our community for the men that we serve. There was great support from the board and the community to keep the Lighthouse open but to no avail.

What education and/or community events did you participate in?

- We participated in the Idaho State Liquor Division's stickering campaign where we
  assisted stickering 5,000 bags that were distributed at the Idaho liquor stores to provide
  underage drinking awareness. Picture
- We participated in the IROAR Recovery Day in Gem County sponsored by the Gem County Community Recovery Center Picture

- We held a recovery day event at the Caldwell Train Depot where we had 24 exhibitors who donated raffle prizes in the excess of \$2,500 and had roughly 500+ plus visitors and supported our Canyon County Community Recovery Center Picture
- We supported the annual ICADD nomination, the annual Mental Health Advocate nomination, and the Idaho Career Recognition Award nomination Picture of Vito
- Ongoing participation in the CITC (Crisis Intervention Team Collaborative)
- Ongoing participation with the TAC (Teen Assessment Center) through existing board members
- Ongoing participation in the PFS (Partnership for Success) Grant provided by Idaho's
   ODP (Office of Drug Policy)
- Ongoing participation in the development of recovery housing in Payette County provided through the Fletcher Group and WICAP
- Supported efforts to increase behavioral health awareness at Duck Valley Reservation

There is a need for all types of healthcare and behavioral health services with a critical staffing shortage with a critical access need.

Access to services via the Problem Solving Courts (Mental Health Court, Veteran's Court, DUI court, Family Court, and Drug Court) have increased and could be expanded.

Do you feel access to Substance Use Disorder services (Prevention, Treatment, Recovery) in your Region has improved, decreased, or is staying the same? Please explain why.

There has been an increase in participation for services at the Recovery Centers. We would like to support an increase in recovery support and peer support services.

Owyhee County Recovery Center had to be closed due to the staffing shortage and lack of participation and awareness.

A number of agencies have closed, particularly smaller business owners, however, there have been larger agencies open up to capture some of the need.

Please provide a brief 20-50 word quote from a community member, peer, or BHB member about the importance of mental health services in your region.

Idaho currently ranks 7<sup>th</sup> in the nation with the highest mental health problems. With suicide rates also increasing, it is significantly important that we serve the members of our State with the highest quality of mental health providers. With the current staffing shortage, access to mental health services is extremely challenging, therefore putting up a barrier for adult and children to receive the mental health care they so desperately need.
